More than 8,000 teachers were using the curriculum throughout North America. We are pleased that you join them in recognizing the importance of sound environmental education for our children.

By understanding the importance of an integrated waste disposal system and the New 3 Rs, your students will learn that, through their own actions, they can make a positive difference in the world.
